# 45 YEARS OF CARING

Supporting the mission and vision of Carolina Caring

45 years ago, Hospice of Catawba Valley, Inc. was chartered as the first hospice in the Unifour area and one of the first three to be established in North Carolina. The first staff member was hired in 1980. That year, Hospice of Catawba Valley served 18 people out of First Presbyterian Church in downtown Hickory. Ten years later, Hospice of Catawba Valley moved to the Willard House in downtown Hickory and served 118 patients with only 11 staff members.

In 1997, Dave Clarke was brought on as Executive Director who led the organization through the development and construction of our Robinson Road campus after the land was donated to us by Johnnie Buff, a dedicated volunteer and advocate for our organization, along with the financial support of donors like yourself!

Since 2003, Carolina Caring Foundation has cultivated relationships with donors like you who share the same passion of fulfilling the mission and vision of Carolina Caring. The Foundation supports Carolina Caring by securing funding, cultivating community partnerships, and connecting donors to the needs of patients and families. This allows us to serve individuals who may otherwise go without care.

**Today, Carolina Caring is happy to serve 12 counties, stretching from Mecklenburg to McDowell, Caldwell to Cleveland, and everywhere in between. We are proud of our history and our achievements, but we also know that there is much more to be done.**

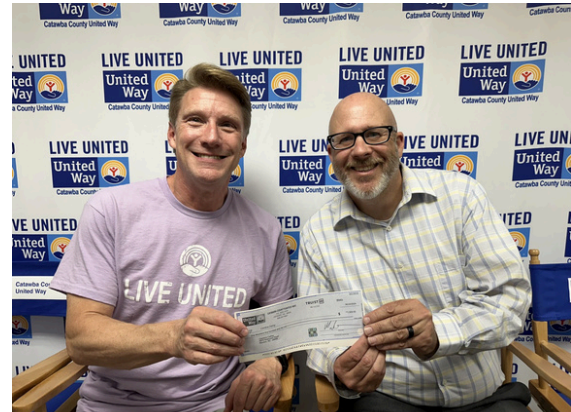
