

Hospice Care

Compassionate care provided to individuals nearing the end of life and support for their families. This specialized team approach focuses on the physical, mental, and spiritual aspects of care that can be provided wherever you call home. Three Hospice Houses are available to provide comfort, care, and compassion for patients with acute medical needs.

Palliative Medicine

Palliative medicine is provided to individuals living with serious illness who would like to manage their physical symptoms with or without seeking curative treatments. This provider-lead program is an extra layer of support that helps patients make informed healthcare decisions and minimize trips to the emergency department.

Cardinal Kids (Pediatric Palliative and Hospice Care)

Community-based healthcare program for children with serious illnesses. Cardinal Kids helps children experience joy despite their medical challenges, reducing pain and managing symptoms while addressing the emotional, social, and spiritual needs of the child and their family.

Grief and Healing (Bereavement Support)

Grief support, including groups and workshops, is offered at no cost to families of hospice patients for up to 13 months following a death. Counseling services are also available to anyone in the community who has experienced loss.

House Calls (Home-Based Primary Care)

Home-based primary care program designed for serious illness patients who have limited ability or physical difficulty getting to a doctor's office. Once an individual joins the House Calls program, Carolina Caring becomes the primary care provider for that patient.

Caregiver Solutions

Provides patients and their families with personalized support for daily activities in the home, including bathing, light housekeeping, home sitting, and companion care, in an effort to enhance patient quality of life. Offered within 30 miles of our Newton Campus.

Advanced Cardiac Care

Integrates the latest medical advancements with compassionate support to help patients with advanced heart failure manage their symptoms and receive optimal treatment.

Advanced Lung Care

Provides expert care to patients with lung diseases affecting the airways, lung tissue, or blood flow to help patients manage their symptoms and receive optimal treatment.

Dementia Care

Provides care to patients with advanced Dementia through symptom management to increase patient comfort and stability. Also, provides educational resources and counseling to help patients and families cope with progressive illness.

Veterans Care

Specialized care that addresses the unique needs of veterans and their families and ensures their service and sacrifice are recognized.

Community Engagement

Community Engagement educates, connects, and supports community partners and the faith community by providing health education and care resources that promote awareness and wellbeing.

Clinical Outreach

Clinical Outreach connects, supports, and collaborates with clinical partners across Carolina Caring's service areas to ensure strengthened relationships and seamless care coordination that enhances patient outcomes.

Government Affairs

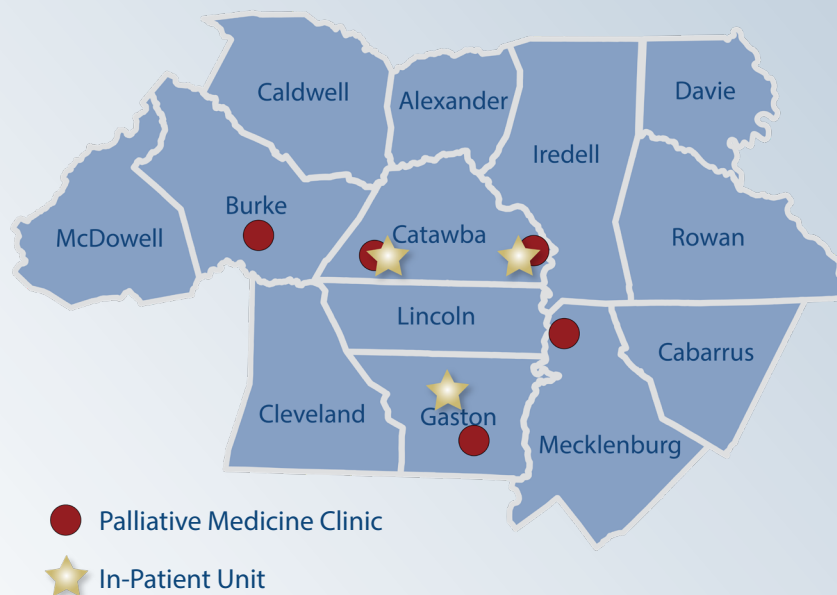
Government Affairs monitors and advocates for public policy that impacts serious illness care and keeps internal and external stakeholders informed on key legislative and regulatory issues.
